
The Assad Government Documents: Preserving the Path to Justice

For over a decade, SJAC has collected documentation of the Syrian conflict to facilitate transitional justice and accountability efforts. After the fall of Bashar al-Assad, SJAC preserved and digitized over 700,000 government documents from prisons and military and intelligence facilities in and around Damascus, Raqqa, Hassakeh, and Qamishli. Over the coming years, the team hopes to analyze this trove of documents within SJAC's Bayanat database, ensuring that they can be used for justice and accountability processes, and making them publicly available to the Syrian people.

The following report features a selection of the documents in SJAC's collection, providing a preview of the type of evidence they contain and how they could support future justice processes.

Assad Government Documents Collected by SJAC



Support for Missing Persons Investigations

SJAC's collection includes extensive records on government detainees, many of whose fates and whereabouts are still unknown. The first three documents, retrieved from two separate locations, reference a detainee named Abu [full name redacted], who was detained by Air Force Intelligence and subsequently died at Mezzeh Military Airport seven years later. By linking together different documents on the same detainee, SJAC's analysts can track the fates of missing persons, helping to provide information to individual families, while also understanding patterns of government detention that can support broader investigations. Subsequent documents include lists of names of detainees who allegedly died in detention, which could be shared with their loved ones, as well as information on government policies regarding the disposal of human remains.

Document #1 - Correspondence on Abu 1

This document contains correspondence from the head of the Air Force Intelligence Special Missions Branch to the head of Air Force Intelligence Directorate. Dated 21 June 2012. Abu is accused of instigating demonstrations. The Branch Head requests that Abu's case be referred to the Intelligence Directorate. The document includes identifying information about Abu (including his full name, son's name, and approximate address), which could help investigators confirm his identity with his family.

Document #2 - Correspondence on Abu 2

Four days later, on 25 June 2012, the head of the Air Force Intelligence Directorate corresponded with the Shu'abat al-Mukhabarat (likely the Military Intelligence Directorate), copying the reports in document #1. This correspondence references Abu and asks that "the issue" be dealt with. This is likely a request to arrest Abu. Again, the document provides in depth identifying information on Abu; it also provides important evidence as to the likely entity that arrested Abu.



Document #3 - Death of Abu

Photographed by SJAC in Qabun Military Police Headquarters - December 2024:

Issued seven years later and dated 13 May 2019, this correspondence is from the head of Military Police (Investigation and Prisons Branch) to the head of Damascus Military Police regarding Abu's death. This document could be shared with the family to provide information on the alleged death of Abu and his likely date of death. Using the date of death and entities involved, investigators can also begin to hypothesize where Abu's body may have been buried.

Document #4 -List of Deceased Detainees

Photographed by SJAC in Qabun Military Police Headquarters December 2024

This log was produced by the Military Police – Military Criminal Investigations Detachment of Tishreen Military Hospital and records the names and ID numbers of 25 allegedly deceased detainees. The report alleges these detainees died at Tishreen Military Hospital as a result of various natural causes, however, SJAC believes they likely died in prison. All 25 detainees died within the same five days in November 2015 and this document is one page of a larger volume which records 467 detainee deaths in the final two months of 2015 alone.

These records could be used to inform families of their loved ones alleged death in detention. However, the lack of identifying information beyond first and last name and ID number may make it difficult to confirm each individual's identity.

In case of death or killing of terrorists, Mr. Director of the Directorate would be informed, their names would be documented with referral to the Administrative Branch. When the corpses of the killed are brought to the Branch, they [i.e. the corpses] would be handed over to the military hospitals [initials in Arabic meaning "via"] the unit's doctor and Mr Major General, the Directorate Head, would be informed. etc...



Document #5 - Mezzeh Military Airport

A letter dated December 23, 2012, from the Investigation Branch of the Air Force Intelligence Directorate (AFID) to all associated branches. The letter informs officials that, in accordance with a directive from the National Security Bureau and the head of the AFID, branch directors must document all detainees who were killed or died in custody and forward that information to the Investigative Branch. A handwritten portion at the end of the letter informs officials that all bodies should be handed over to the military hospital associated with the specific branch where the detainee died. The note then reaffirms that all deaths would be reported to the director of the AFID. This is the first known evidence of the Syrian government issuing instructing on how to deal with deceased detainees.



Support for Criminal Trials and Institutional Reform

Many of the documents in SJAC's collection record incidents of criminal acts and often include the names of those committing the acts, or their bosses, who could also bear criminal responsibility. These documents could support individual criminal cases, as well as broader truth telling processes and subsequent institutional reform.



On October 14, 2013, the citizen [redacted name], whose mother is [redacted name], born in Damascus [redacted information], a resident of Babbila, filed a complaint that he was detained for four days by the National Defence Forces in Jaramana on October 8, 2013 for extortion. During his detention in the headquarters' prison, he met the detainee - [redacted name], whose mother is [redacted name], Born in Idleb [redacted information], works as a vendor of second-hand items in Jaramana and lives there - charged with counterfeiting ID cards. At that time, the person called [redacted name] nicknamed [redacted name], from the headquarters' staff and in charge of the prison, negotiated with the mentioned [person] for a sum of money that amounted to 200,000 Syrian Pounds in exchange for his release. When the headquarters' security officer, [redacted name], arrived, he told the detainee that he had to please [i.e. bribe] the prison head, [redacted name]. Eventually, it was agreed on a sum of money that amounted to 150,000 Syrian Pounds and the detainee's wife, [redacted name], whose mother is [redacted name], Born in Suweyda [redacted information], was called to secure the mentioned sum [of money], hoping for the release of her husband. The mentioned [wife] together with her husband's brother, [redacted name], sold the furniture of the house where they live for 70,000 Syrian Pounds and sold her gold asset in order to secure the sum [of money]. Afterwards, the mentioned [wife] took the sum [of money] to the National Defense [Forces] Headquarters and gave it to the person called [redacted name] at the behest of the headquarters' security officer, [redacted name]. Nevertheless, her husband was transferred to a location she does not know. She still does not know anything regarding her husband and is willing to come forward to explain the circumstances around the issue, noting that the National Defence Forces threatened her and her husband's brother in case they say anything. Moreover, her husband was detained previously by [redacted name] and a sum that amounted to 80,000 Syrian Pounds was taken [from him] in exchange for his release.

The source adds that he witnessed in prison a 24-year-old woman from Darayya who has been detained since October 1, 2013 and she does not know the reason for her detention. Moreover, the National Defence Forces have sex with her inside the headquarters and with the knowledge of the security officer and the prison head, [redacted name]. She has not been released to date.

In prison, there is one [member] of the National Defence Forces in Sayyeda Zeynab, from the group of the person called [redacted name], and [the detainee] is called [redacted name], who has been detained since the beginning of the month, and they are demanding a sum of money that amounts to 40,000 Syrian Pounds in order to release him.

Document #6 - Evidence of NDF Crimes

This letter from the Airforce Intelligence Directorate (AFID) details a source who witnessed several abuses committed by the National Defense Forces (NDF) while in their custody. Incidents included a detained man whose wife sold their assets to pay for his release, only for him to disappear shortly after payment, as well as a woman who was detained without knowing the reason and repeatedly raped in custody. This document provides evidence of NDF crimes, as well as proof that high level individuals within the Syrian government were aware of those crimes.


We received the following information:

There is a person called [redacted name], Born in 1949, from [Redacted location] village, and lives in Al-Hajar Al-Aswad area near [redacted information]. He was a former member in Arab Socialist Ba'th Party and was dismissed from the party due to espionage (according to the source). He was previously [redacted information], was dismissed and referred to investigation in 2010 with his son [redacted name] and a person called [redacted name]. The Warrant Officer First Class, [redacted name], nicknamed Abu Mohammad, told them to evacuate the house from documents, books, CDs, recording machines, and papers on which important names were written. Currently, he delivers flash drives and memory cards to a person called [redacted name] through hiding them in large luncheon tins sealed from outside.

- -Information states that the person called [redacted name] is in contact with a doctor from [redacted information] and he is funding him [unclear who this person is] in order to distribute huge amounts of money on poor people to recruit them to his side.
- -Information also stated that the person called [redacted name] is in contact with Sheikh [redacted name] and he is [redacted information] and he is in direct contact with Muslim Brotherhood's chief, [redacted name], and that they are aware of the two bombings that occurred recently in Damascus and who coordinated that action. Moreover, the person called [redacted name] has a mobile phone with the number [redacted information] [and] was aware of the car bombing. He is one of the relatives of Sariya Ar-Rifa'i and Osama Ar-Rifa'i and receives orders from both of them during meeting that they held in Kafar Souseh area along with a number of instigating young men.
- -Information states that the person called [redacted information] coordinates with a group consisting of 15 suicide bombers from Saqba area.
- There is a person called [redacted name], originally from Al-Qadmous area and serves at Palestine Branch, who leaks information and documents to a person called [redacted name] and informs him about reports received against him. He also handed him over a copy of a book (of a yellow color and is in the mentioned branch), that contains methods of torture in Syrian prisons, in order to copy it and distribute it to the rebels (as they put it).
- -There is also an association called [redacted information] that was founded by Sheikh [redacted name] and Sheikh [redacted name] and chaired by [redacted name]. The association's purpose is ostensibly helping the poor people. However, its main purpose is [...]

Document#7 - Torture Methods

This is an internal communication document issued by the Special Tasks Branch of the Air Force Intelligence at the Mazzeh Military Airport which was sent to a Lieutenant Colonel and a Brigadier General, who is addressed as head of Air Force Intelligence. This intelligence report details an official at the Palestine Branch known to be leaking information. The report claims he removed a yellow book from the facility which details torture methods used in Syrian prisons. This is the first time this book has been referenced, and it is an acknowledgement that torture was a standard, documented practice with government facilities.

He was handed over to us by the Kurdish YPG militias after he had been detained by them for coming to Syria in order to join ISIS terrorist organization. During our interrogation of him, he admitted that after the events in Syria and Iraq have started, and by following Arabic and foreign satellite [TV] channels, as well as by [browsing] websites, particularly those of ISIS terrorist organization and watching many speeches of the organization's leaders, especially the terrorist Abu Bakr Al-Baghdadi, and his declaration of an Islamic Caliphate in Iraq and Syria – he was influence by that and decided to come to Syria in order to join the ISIS terrorist organization for Jihad. In May 2016, he booked a roundtrip ticket from Charles de Gaulle Airport in Paris to Istanbul Airport in order to deceive others into that he was coming for travel and tourism and to keep himself out of suspicion. Afterwards, he downloaded a map showing the locations of the terrorist groups in Syria, including ISIS, from a Russian website. [Redacted information] arrived at the Istanbul Airport and directly flew to from there to Gaziantep Airport where he rented a car, model Renault Clio, and headed to Kilis City then entered the Syrian territories illegally via AsSalama border crossing point and headed to A'zaz city relying on the map he downloaded on his phone searching for the locations of ISIS terrorist organization. After leaving Azaz, he came across a checkpoint of the Kurdish YPG militias without knowing, and when they knew that he came to join ISIS organization [...]

He was referred to the Anti-Terrorism Court on December 8, 2018 and was brought back to us from Damascus Central Prison Branch on October 25, 2019 after he was released from the Anti-Terrorism Court according to oral instructions by National Security Bureau to keep him in our custody in order to utilize him for security purposes.

[H a n d w r i t t e n] Contacting our Russian friends to benefit from him (to show to which extent [he could be] utilized). In case there is no benefit from him, hand him over to the Immigration and Passports to deport him and issue a ban on his entry.

Document #8 - Frenchman

Photographed by SJAC in General Intelligence HQ, Damascus in 12/14/2024

This detainee is reportedly a French national from Tunisia who was handed over to the Syrian government by the YPG after attempting to enter Syria to join ISIS. A handwritten note on the page documents that the Syrian authorities contacted their Russian counterparts to determine if this individual could be of use to them. We do not know his fate, but the note ordered the man's deportation if the Russians were unable to utilize him.
